In the next year I hope to finish two main projects that I have worked on since around the beginning of the year. The first one is a tool classification system. The second item is to work with the online training system, Moodle. Depending on the tool classification a tool might be suitable for online training. I am working with several people to make this a reality. It should help people gain access to tools easier as well as focus instructors on to more advanced classes.

Most of all though I will work to make the Makerspace grow in capabilities and facilities.
